



### Mural depicts Baltimore History

Sweet Sin's owner Richard D'Sousa is reinventing the restaurant space at 27th and Howard. He is opening *Meet 27* and with it an indoor mural created by MICA students and some local residents.

Richard spoke with Dominic Terlizzi about the new place that was opening up next to Sweet Sin and mentioned that he wanted a mural to depict Baltimore. A professor at MICA, Terlizzi contacted some of his students and offered them a chance to explore this project. Of course, as good artists, they first got to eat some of the restaurant's food to get inspired, then they brainstormed and sketched. The final mural is a combination of ideas generated.

The goal of the mural was to brighten up the place, create some cheer, celebrate De'Sousa's brilliant foods, create community, explore local folklore persona and myth, utilize art in the world, and have a lot of fun.

The main creators of the two panels are Dave Eassa, Yana Yashina, Louis Abbene-Meagley, with Taylor Black and Andrew Thorp helping out. Several other neighborhood members joined to reflect on and help paint the images.

The murals are located on the upper dining area of the interior restaurant space at *Meet 27*. No opening date has been set for the restaurant.
